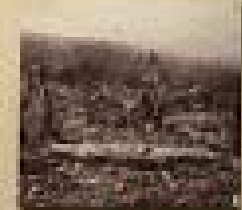

Outport Fishing Communities. For many the backbone of Newfoundland and Labrador has been its small, rural fishing communities. The majority of these were built around the inshore family-run cod fishery.

Beaumont Hamel. On the morning of July 9, 1916 the 1st Newfoundland Regiment went into battle at Beaumont Hamel, France. In less than half an hour 110 of 170 men were killed or wounded. It was the most terrible calamity of World War I for Newfoundland and Labrador. The shock of the scale of this single-day loss had huge, long-lasting impacts on every part of society.



Confederation. The decision to join Canada in 1949 was a century of political independence for Newfoundland and Labrador.



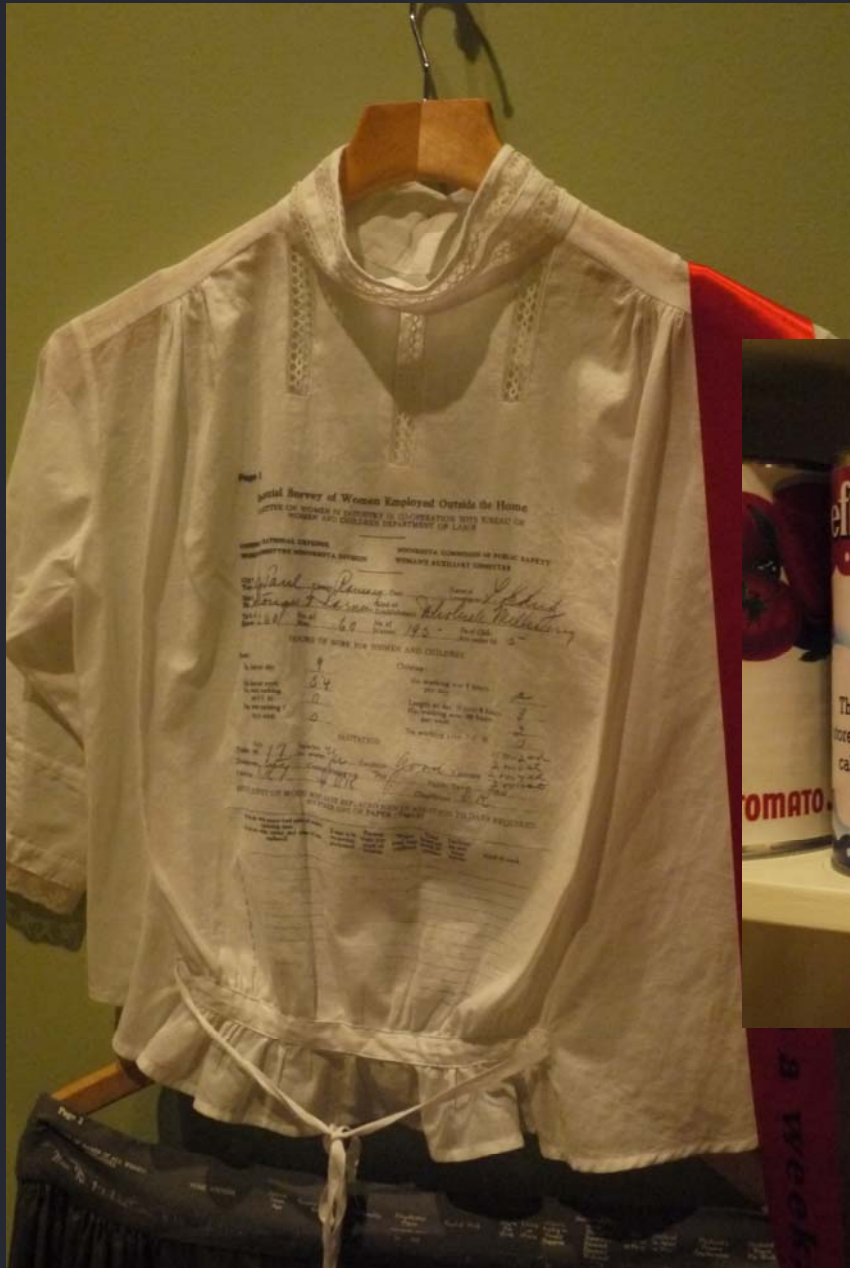

NOT ALL ARCTIC ICE IS THE SAME.

Polar bears depend on thick, sturdy ice sheets for hunting seals. Because the Arctic is growing warmer, more of that kind of ice is vanishing, threatening the bears' ability to find food.

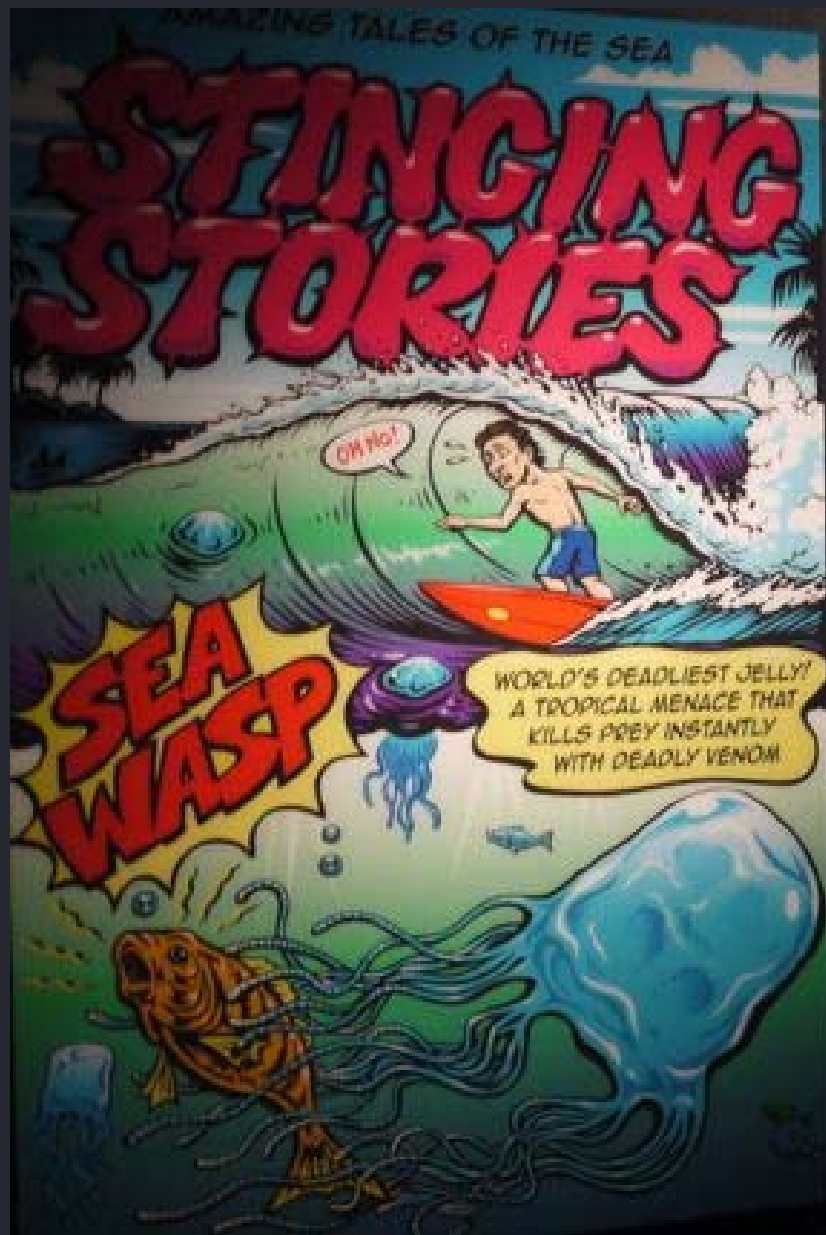
TWO KINDS OF ARCTIC ICE:

New ice is the thin, smooth layer that forms in winter and often melts away in summer.

Multi-year ice has survived many summer melts and gets thicker each year.

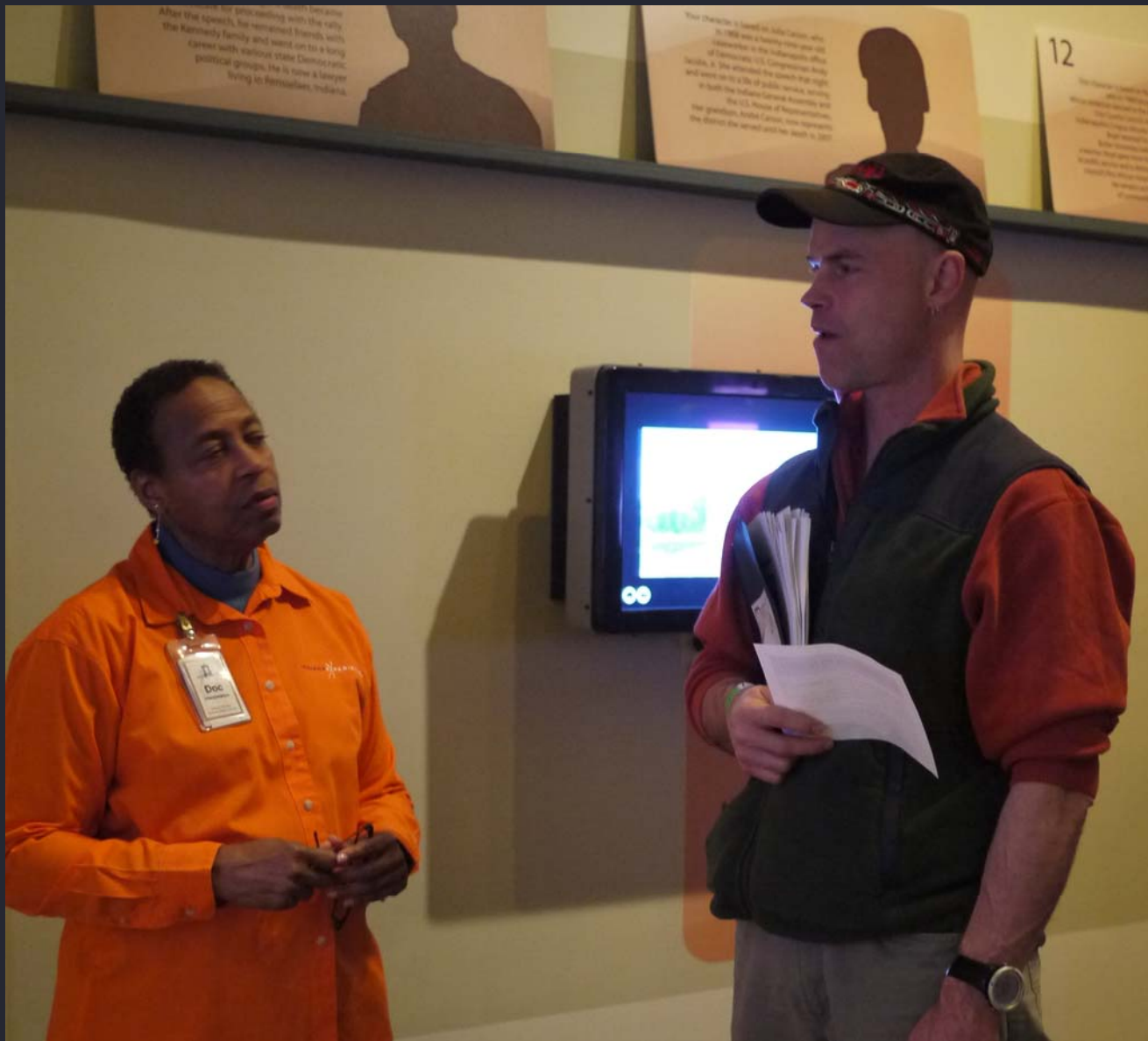
Touch the "ice" on these tables to discover how Arctic ice cover is changing.
